

## Announcement of the Bureau of Information and Communication Technology, Office of the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Education Subject: Policy on not accepting gifts or gratuities for performing duties (No Gift Policy) Fiscal Year B.E. 2568 (2025)

The Bureau of Information and Communication Technology, Office of the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Education, recognizes the importance of combating corruption and misconduct to instill a culture of integrity in the performance of duties. This commitment aligns with ethical standards and the Civil Service Code of Ethics, fostering an organizational culture of morality and transparency. In line with the objective for all government agencies to declare their commitment to being organizations where all executives and government officials neither give nor accept any gifts or gratuities in the performance of their duties (No Gift Policy). The Bureau of Information and Communication Technology prioritizes and fully supports the implementation of the Government's policy, in accordance with the National Reform Plan on the Prevention and Suppression of Corruption and Misconduct.

Therefore, as a declaration of intent to combat all forms of corruption, all personnel must uphold integrity, adhere to ethical principles, maintain transparency, ensure non-discrimination, and be accountable by cultivating a culture of integrity in duty performance as a fundamental part of the organization. The Bureau of Information and Communication Technology hereby establishes and declares its policy of "refraining from receiving or giving" gifts, gratuities, including any other benefits in connection with performing duties—whether before or after the performance of duties—as such actions may lead to corruption and misconduct, both in the present and in the future.

This declaration has been made for the purpose of acknowledgment and shall be strictly adhered to.
